

REFURBISHMENT

Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church | 2018 - 2019

50 Years

The official opening ceremony of St Nicholas Church took place on Sunday 29 October 1967. Approximately 600 people attended the opening ceremony, The construction was considered fully complete on 30 October 1968.

Original Design

The Church has been altered from the original design. Some of those alterations will be reversed including removing the timber dado, repainting moulded trims around the windows white and renovating the exterior walls to blend and improve patches that exist.

Heritage

The works outlined in the refurbishment will be carried out to achieve a good conservation outcome. This will contribute to the heritage significance so that the church can be nominated to the ACT Heritage Register, to be granted heritage registration as a building with a strong association with the Greek community of the ACT.



Refurbishment 2018 - 2019

The Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church in Kingston will undergo refurbishment works from the end of 2018 and throughout 2019. This will include reinstating original form and fabric to the Church to bring it back to the original design as well as as refurbishment of elements of the church which have become tired and in need of an uplift after 50 years. Church Services will continue as usual.

The following works will be undertaken:

External

- Repair of the patches and weak areas on the exterior walls in a similar finish to the original and in original colours;
- Repair the bell tower eaves;
